BACAR-13 2025

It was the kind of morning that makes a ham reach for their handheld before their coffee. Saturday 11 October, just past 06:00, and the TRMC Model Flying Airfield in Trichardt/Secunda was already buzzing. The sun was barely up, the breeze gentle, and the parking lot filling with cars, cables, and caffeine-fuelled curiosity.





Gazebos popped up like contest stations at Field Day. Tables came alive with payloads in every shade of neon, and hams from across the region gathered with soldering irons, laptops, and that unmistakable glint of launchday excitement. BACAR-13 was about to take flight—and so were our spirits.





Final tweaks were made. Payloads were tested. Someone asked if the balloon needed a callsign. Someone else tried to tune their HT to the frequency of breakfast. And then, with a collective breath held tighter than a coax crimp, the hydrogen balloon lifted off—carrying CubeSats, APRS beacons, and the hopes of every ham who ever dreamed of touching the edge of space.





Among the early-morning heroes was Nico, President of the SARL, who bravely stepped up to help fill the hydrogen balloon. For a moment, as he wrangled the expanding beast with calm determination, someone whispered, "Is his APRS beacon on?"—just in case he got carried away. Soon it became a three-man tango, with hams flanking the balloon like ground crew at a rocket launch. The balloon's weight tugged and twisted, but never once cracked the smiles on their faces. It was a scene worthy of a QSL card: three hams, one balloon, and a whole lot of lift.









With Nico and crew holding the balloon like it was a prize-winning marrow at a village fair, it soon became clear that this was no solo mission. It took a few more hands—some gloved, some caffeinated—and a symphony of careful strapping to tame the hydrogen beast. The balloon swayed, hissed, and puffed like a diva preparing for stage, but the team held firm. With payloads prepped and APRS beacons blinking like disco lights, the final knots were tied and the launch countdown began. It was time to let it fly.





The balloon reached for the stratosphere, transmitting telemetry and APRS data like a seasoned contester flinging out CQ calls. Payloads pinged, chirped, and beeped their way into the record books. One even sent back a message that read, "I can see your shack from here."





Unfortunately, about an hour into the flight, the parachute was overcome with fear of heights and held on to its package like a squirrel clutching its last peanut. No graceful descent—just a stubborn payload refusing to let go.

Enter Hamnet: our off-road angels in reflective vests and boots that have seen things. With precision, grit, and a touch of 4x4 flair, they tracked the balloon's final coordinates like seasoned DX chasers on a muddy mission. One operator swore he saw the payload blink Morse code for "Help." Another claimed it tried to negotiate landing rights.









Back at the clubhouse, hopeful operators gathered like penguins around a heater—eager to inspect their gear, assess the damage, and download the data. The atmosphere? Pure ham joy. Laughter echoed between download attempts. Payloads were poked, prodded, and praised. Someone asked, "Did yours survive?"

BACAR-13 wasn't just a technical triumph—it was a celebration of amateur radio's spirit: experimentation, education, and a healthy dose of eccentricity. From newcomers decoding telemetry with the precision of a Swiss watchmaker to seasoned ops swapping stories like Q-codes at a braai, the day reminded us that ham radio isn't just about frequencies—it's about fellowship, flair, and the occasional airborne panic.

And somewhere in the stratosphere, a CubeSat still dreams of its next launch, whispering, "Next time, I'm bringing my own parachute. And snacks."



"BACAR 13 may be logged and decoded, but the next chapter is already crackling on the horizon. With fresh payloads, new operators twitching in excitement, BACAR 14 promises to launch us into even wilder skies. Stay tuned—our next signal might just rewrite the stratosphere."

Standing Wave Ratio, or SWR

Often misunderstood, occasionally ignored, and frequently blamed, SWR remains one of the most critical indicators of station health—and one of the easiest to overlook.

What Is SWR and Why Should You Care?

SWR measures how efficiently your transmitter's power is being delivered to your antenna. A low ratio (close to 1:1) means your signal is sailing smoothly into the ether. A high ratio (above 3:1) means energy is bouncing back toward your rig—a technical echo that can cause reduced performance or even equipment damage.



Think of it as a conversation, if your rig and antenna aren't speaking the same language, you're just shouting into the void.

Modern transceivers often include built-in protection, automatically reducing power output when SWR spikes. But that safety net can mask deeper problems—like a misbehaving feedline, a corroded connector, or a squirrel-nibbled balun.

Diagnosing the Shack

SWR isn't just a number—it's a diagnostic tool. It can reveal:

Water intrusion in coaxial cables

Loose connectors or corroded joints

Antenna placement issues (yes, even that tree branch you ignored)

Grounding problems or nearby interference

A Historical Echo: The SWR Awakening

The importance of SWR wasn't always obvious. In the early days of amateur radio, operators relied on trial, error, and intuition. It wasn't until the 1940s—when commercial SWR meters became more accessible - those hams began to truly understand the relationship between impedance, reflection, and signal loss.

One pivotal moment came in 1941, when the U.S. military began using SWR measurements to optimize radar systems. Amateur operators quickly adopted the technique, and by the 1950s, SWR meters were standard shack equipment. The phrase "match your load" became gospel—and the SWR meter, a trusted oracle.

Top 5 SWR Troubleshooting Tips

Inspect Your Coax
 Water intrusion, cracks, or age-related wear can wreak havoc.

Replace old feedlines and check for moisture near connectors.

- Tighten Every Connector
 A loose PL-259 or oxidized joint can spike your SWR. Clean, tighten, and reseat every connection from rig to antenna.
- 3. Check Antenna Placement
 Nearby metal objects, gutters, fences, or even trees can
 reflect RF. Try repositioning or elevating your antenna.
- Test with a Dummy Load
 If your SWR is high, swap in a dummy load. If the reading drops, the issue is likely in your antenna system—not your rig.
- 5. Use an External SWR Meter
 Built-in meters are helpful, but external ones offer better
 accuracy and visibility. Compare readings to confirm.



6. Do you prefer rag chewing, contesting, experimenting, or another form of comms?


Mostly Contesting. When work pressure allows.

The Shack Survival Kit

What every ham should keep within arm's reach (and why it's not just about solder)

Murphy doesn't knock—he barges in. One moment you're calling CQ, the next your mic cable's frayed, your rig's rebooting, and your coffee's gone cold. That's why every amateur radio operator needs a Shack Survival Kit: a stash of essentials that can rescue your signal, your sanity, and your snack break.

Shack Survival Kit, Part 2: Beyond the Bench—The Extras That Keep You On the Air (and Off the Edge)

If Part 1 of your Shack Survival Kit was about surviving Murphy's ambush, Part 2 is about thriving in spite of it. Because once you've got your soldering iron, sticky notes, and emergency biltong in place, it's time to think bigger. Think club-tested, contest-approved, and chaos-resistant.

Here's what every ham should consider adding to their extended Shack Survival Kit—especially when the bands are buzzing and the gremlins are grinning.

 - Water bottle with a lid: Because nothing says "rig reboot" like a splash of rooibos on your VFO.
 - Snack stash: Granola bars, dried fruit, or emergency jellybeans. Bonus points if they're colorcoded by band.

✓ The Shack Maintenance Module

- Mini vacuum or dust brush: For clearing out cobwebs, crumbs, and the occasional desiccated gecko.
- Label maker or masking tape: Because "mystery coax" is only fun once.
- WD-40 and contact cleaner: For squeaky knobs and stubborn switches. Also doubles as morale booster when sprayed dramatically.
- The "I Swear I Had One" Box
 - Spare patch cables: Because the one you need will vanish mid-contest.
 - Extra mic and headphones: For when your primary set decides to retire mid-QSO.
 - USB adapters, splitters, and gender changers: Because digital modes are picky and Murphy loves USB-C.

n Emergency Essentials

- Tiny screwdriver set: For rescuing rigs from squirrel sabotage.
- Acorn-shaped stress ball: For squeezing during pileups or firmware updates.
- Miniature HT keychain: Not functional, but adorable. And morale matters.\

The Mental Backup Kit

- Printed band plan: Because scrolling during panic is a sport no one wins.
- Club contact list: For when you need help, advice, or someone to say "Try turning it off and on again."
- Inspirational QSL card: That one DX you chased for months. Frame it. Worship it. Let it remind you why you do this.

Final Thought

Your shack isn't just a workspace—it's a launchpad, a refuge, and occasionally, a comedy show. The extended Shack Survival Kit isn't about over-preparing—it's about staying sane, staying on the air, and staying one step ahead of Murphy (and Nutmeg).

So stock up, label everything, and remember: the best operators aren't just skilled—they're prepared, caffeinated, and slightly squirrel-brained

Long Term HF Propagation for October 2025 By Vincent, ZS6BTY

<u>Local Propagation (up to 500 km)</u>: The F or F2 critical frequency (f_oF2) is the MUF for short range, near vertical incidence sky-wave (NVIS) propagation.

<u>Long Distance Propagation</u>: The MUF for a first hop of 4000 km in the cardinal directions are labelled North, East, South and West. They indicate the direction that propagation may be expected.


